Run by the Transport Systems Catapult on behalf of the Department for Transport (DfT), the competition was officially launched by Baroness Kramer, Minister of State for Transport, on the 24th October.

This challenge supports the government's wider Accessible Britain initiative, encouraging communities to become more inclusive and accessible.

The competition can be entered individually or in teams of up to five participants.

The five finalists will be invited to present their work at the Big Bang Fair 2015, the largest celebration of engineering and science for young people in the UK, where a panel of judges will decide on the competition winner.
