## 1. How did you first come up with the idea?

- Was it your own thoughts?
- Did you work as part of a group?
- Did you take inspiration from other projects or ideas?

#### 2. Why did you choose that idea?

- Were you inspired by a problem such as food waste or food distribution?
- Were you interested in designing something closer to home, like utensils for disabled people or a canteen of the future for your school?

# 3. What was the first thing you did after deciding on your idea?

- Did you draw some sketches?
- Did you talk about it more?
- Did you write any notes?

#### 4. What came next?

- Did you have any problems?
- If you were working in a group, were there any disagreements and did your idea change during the process as a result?

#### 5. Did you do any research?

- For example, did you look at any websites to help you with your design, or did you look at books, or newspapers to help you?
- Did you change your idea based on the research that you did?

# 6. Did you do any practical investigation?

- For example, did you set up a (safe) experiment at home, or perhaps in school?
- Did you need to do any calculations perhaps?
- What were the results of your experiment? Did it go to plan?

#### 7. Did you create any prototypes?

- For example, did you build a tester of your design from paper or cardboard?
- Were you able to create a more advanced prototype maybe with the help of teachers?

#### 8. What did you learn from the process?

- Did your initial thoughts turn into a successful end product/idea/design?
- What went well, and why?
- What didn't go well, and why?
- What have you learned through this experience?

### SUGGESTED FORMATTING

You've got a maximum of 1000 words so use them wisely! We suggest the following formatting to help your entry flow and remember, if you're typing your entry, please make sensible font choices!!

- Introduction (100-250 words)
  - Answering questions 1 and 2 from the list above.
- Main Paragraph (300-500 words)
  - Answering questions 3 7 from the list above.
- Summary/Conclusion (100-250 words)
  - Answering question 8 from the list above
